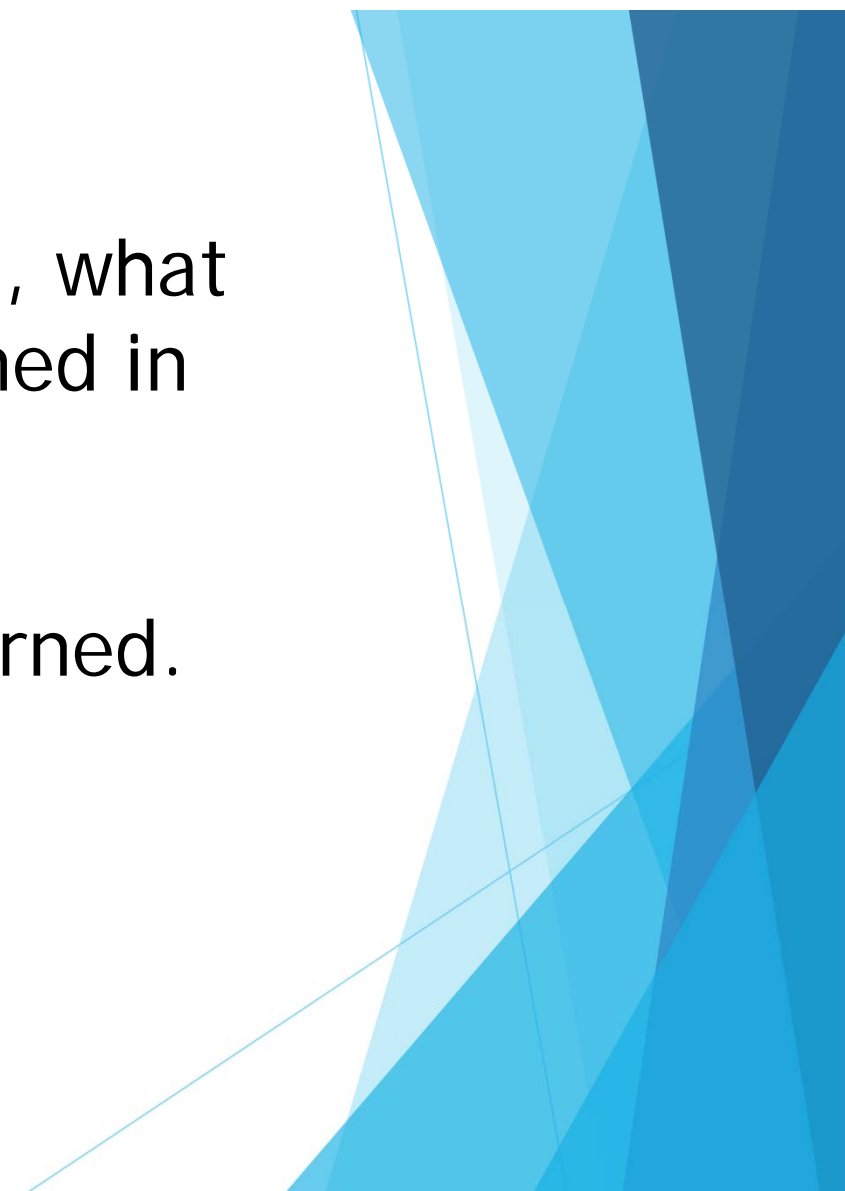

History of Bible Translation



"Lord! Open the King of England's eyes."



These were the final words spoken by William Tyndale, the first person to translate the Bible from its original languages of Greek and Hebrew into English. For doing so, he was strangled to death and burned at the stake. His crime? Heresy for translating the Bible into a language the people of England could understand.

Many may not realize that innocent blood was spilled for us to read the Bible in English today. However, it is imperative that we do not forget the sacrifices of Tyndale and other Christian martyrs. They fought to provide us the opportunity to study the Bible more precisely on our own by giving their lives for this noble cause. Therefore, we ought to be selective when choosing a reliable and accurate Bible translation.

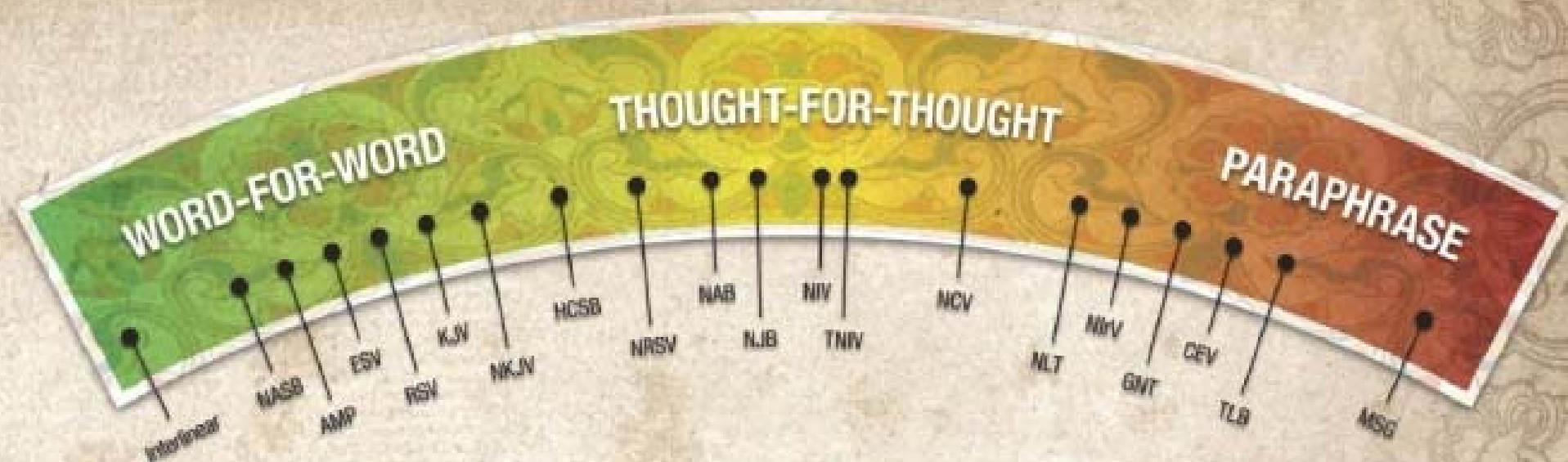

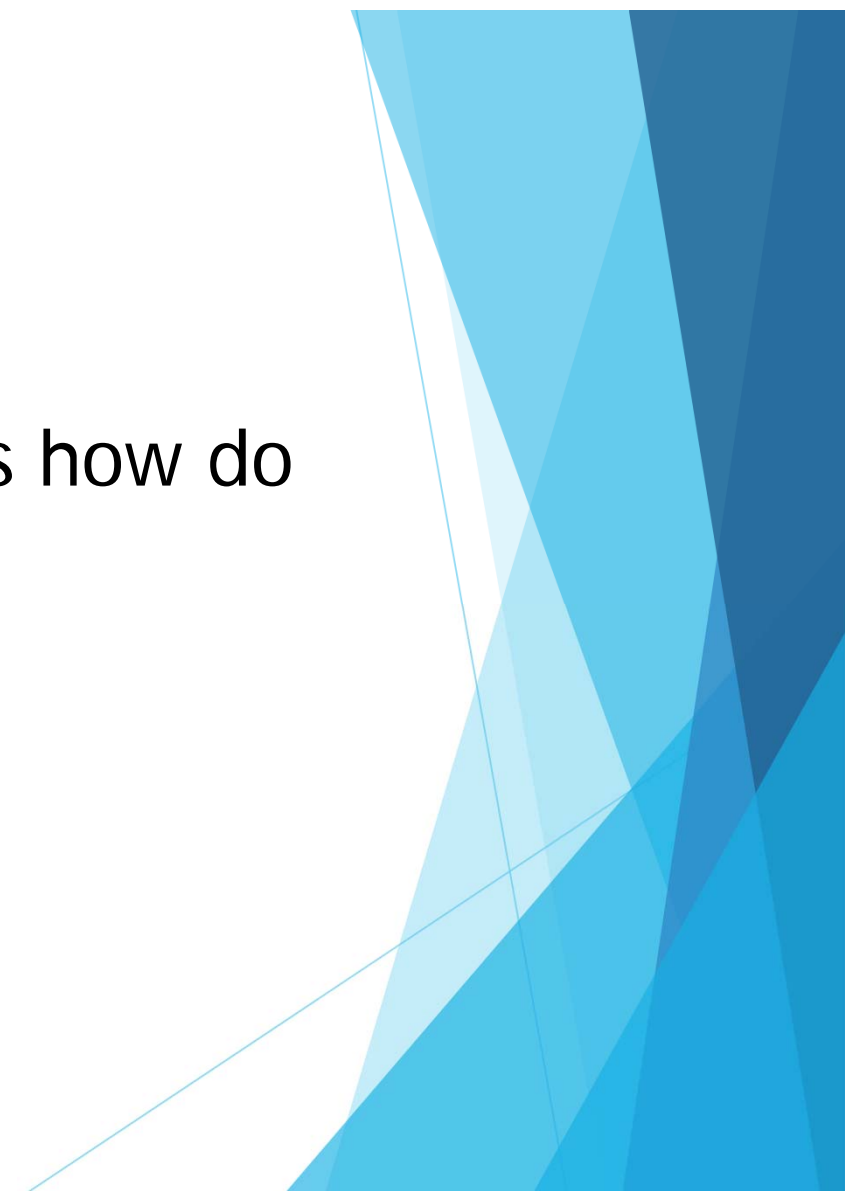




Picking you translation also depends on how you study.

Strong Concordance:

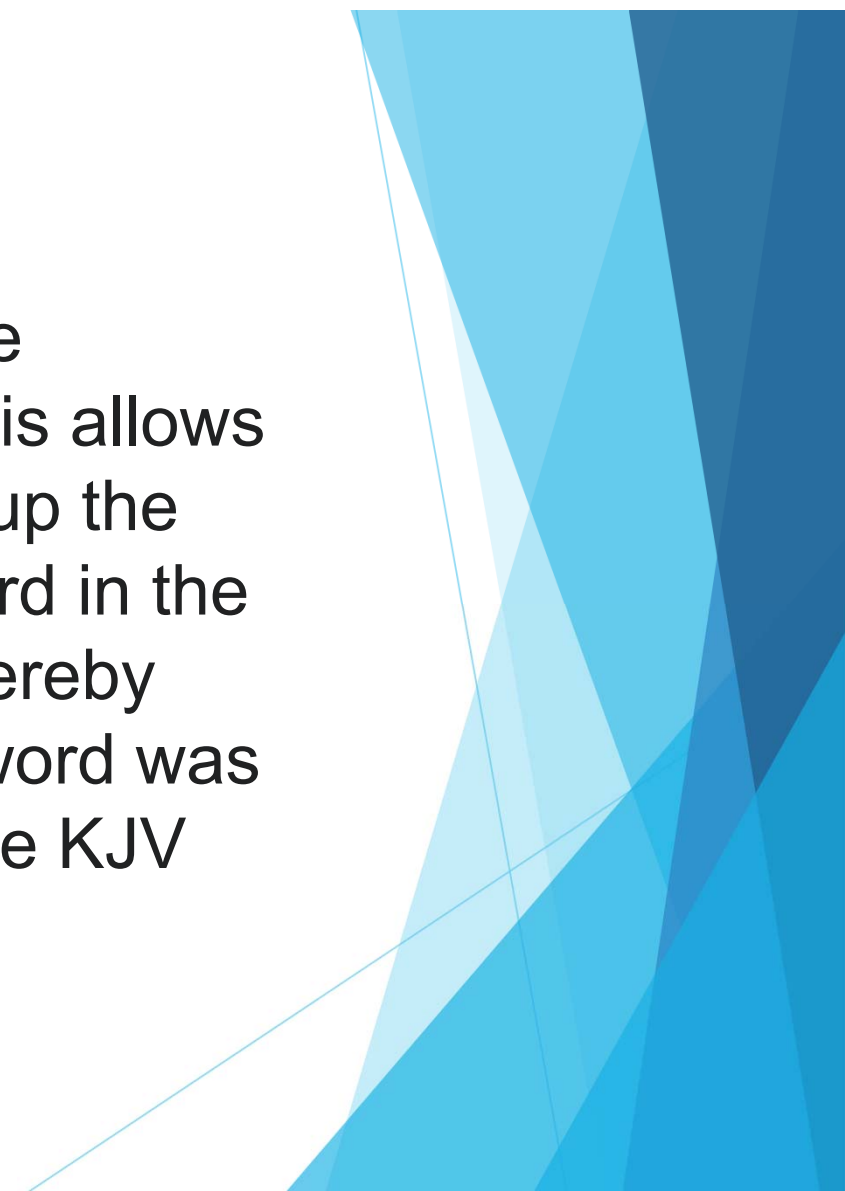
The purpose of *Strong's Concordance* is not to provide content or commentary about the Bible, but to provide an index to the Bible. This allows the reader to find words where they appear in the Bible. This index allows a student of the Bible to re-find a phrase or passage previously studied. It also lets the reader directly compare how the same word may be used elsewhere in the Bible.

Strong Concordance Numbers:

Strong's numbers [\[edit\]](#)

Each original-language word is given an entry number in the dictionary of those original language words listed in the back of the concordance. These have become known as the "Strong's numbers". The main concordance lists each word that appears in the [KJV Bible](#) in alphabetical order with each verse in which it appears listed in order of its appearance in the Bible, with a snippet of the surrounding text (including the word in italics).

Appearing to the right of the scripture reference is the Strong's number. This allows the user of the concordance to look up the meaning of the original language word in the associated dictionary in the back, thereby showing how the original language word was translated into the English word in the KJV Bible.



One of my Favorite translations is called the eth Ceper. This next video gives a brief overview of the eth Ceper.





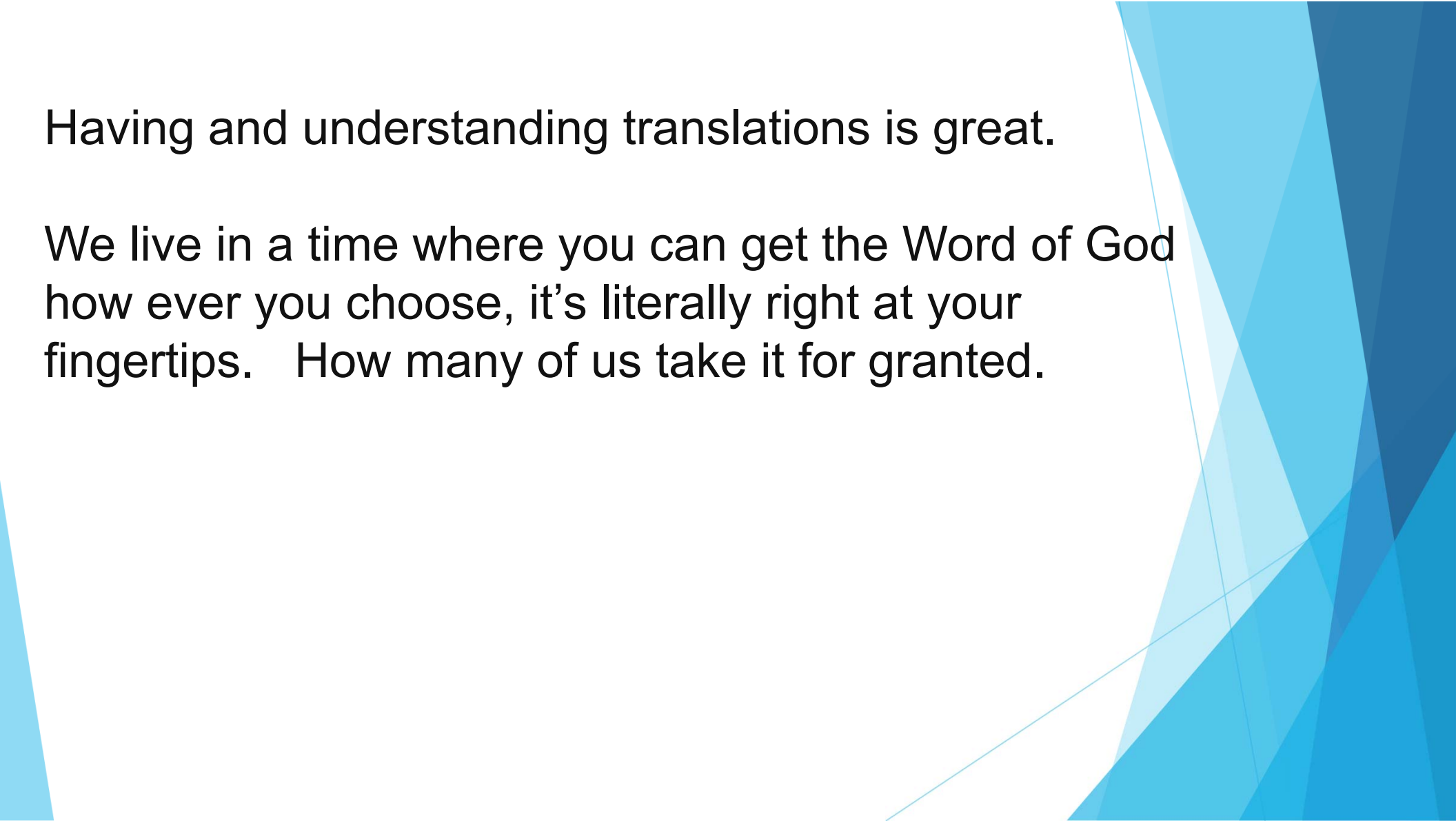
Using multiple solid translation is the way to go.

KJV should be your top 5.

NLT, NIV, or ESV are also good translations.

Having and understanding translations is great.

We live in a time where you can get the Word of God how ever you choose, it's literally right at your fingertips. How many of us take it for granted.



Let us remember the words of Paul to young Timothy.

(NIV)3 But mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. ² People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, ⁴ treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God— ⁵ having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with such people.

⁶ They are the kind who worm their way into homes and gain control over gullible women, who are loaded down with sins and are swayed by all kinds of evil desires, ⁷ always learning but never able to come to a knowledge of the truth. ⁸ Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so also these teachers oppose the truth. They are men of depraved minds, who, as far as the faith is concerned, are rejected. ⁹ But they will not get very far because, as in the case of those men, their folly will be clear to everyone.

¹⁰ You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance, ¹¹ persecutions, sufferings—what kinds of things happened to me in Antioch, Iconium and Lystra, the persecutions I endured. Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them. ¹² In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, ¹³ while evildoers and impostors will go from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived. ¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it,

¹⁵ and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that the servant of God^[a] may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

My Final POINT:

None of this matters if the word of God which is God's spirit isn't planted in you. When God uses us, more than likely it won't be in a format where we have the Bible readily available.
