Homework Policy, Assignment List or Course Requirements

- Homework assignments, quizzes and or tests will be a portion and percentage of the grade as well as the student's attendance.

Attendance Policy

- Student/s should attend classes on time. Student should communicate with the instructor if they are going to be late or not able to attend. Please know that students taking in-person and on-line classes will be allowed 5 minutes past the starting time to be allowed in the class after that the class is closed and you will not be allowed in.
- Instructors will be able to make the decision about students moving forward in classes if attendance and time is an issue.
- Because of the structure of these classes, it's important that the student be committed to class attendance. Current expectation is for an 2 Sunday's per month per class with an anticipated 100% participation.
